



## School Age Connections

**Accountability:** Each unit within a module ends with an application activity that must be submitted and reviewed by the course instructor. Each module ends with a 40 question exam. Students must earn an 80% or higher on the exam to earn a certificate for the module. They have multiple opportunities to take the exam.

### Module 1: Understanding the Development of the School Age Child

This module will introduce you to the development of the School Aged Child. The module will review overall characteristics in this age group and go in-depth to the domains of Social/Emotional, Cognitive, and Physical development. Understanding how youth develop will better enable adults to set appropriate expectations and develop engaging learning experiences for them.

Objectives:

- To become familiar of Overall Developmental Characteristics of the School Aged Child

- To become familiar with Positive Youth Development characteristics and how to promote them

- To become familiar with best practices associated with inclusion of children with special needs
- To assess individual and program needs for inclusion of children with special needs

### **Unit 4: Valuing Diversity**

- To become familiar with best practices associated with teaching acceptance of diversity
- To assess individual and program needs for multiculturalism and diversity

## **Module 2: Successful Programming for School Aged Children**

Developmentally appropriate programs and activities should engage the interest and promote the overall development of school-age children.

This module will review characteristics of high quality programming and methods used to evaluate program quality. It will also cover various curricula used in after school programming to enhance the overall learning environment. An entire Unit offers resources for games and activities and reviews the importance of cooperation versus competition in programs. Developing and maintaining partnerships with parents is also reviewed.

## **Module 3: Guidance for Working with School Aged Children**

Positive, trusting relationships between adults and school age children are critical to high quality learning environments.

This module will focus on how to build positive, trusting relationships with youth through effective communication and guidance strategies. Adult-youth and peer-peer relationships are discussed and strategies offered for promoting overall cooperative environments. Characteristic behaviors of school age children are reviewed and guidance techniques for dealing with behaviors are explored. Having mixed ages in programming can present unique challenges, which are acknowledged as well as the benefits of them in this module.

- To become familiar with effective strategies for dealing with youth conflict in programming
- To discover multiple strategies for positive guidance when working with school aged children

- To explore challenges and advantages for successful programming with mixed aged groups
- To explore the role of the adult in programming for youth
