A needs assessment of the program has identified potential opportunities for the school district to work to better support and extend learning opportunities to participating students. Funds will be used to hire 8 certified teachers to work two hours daily with the programs to provide STEM experiences, computer science and coding experiences, and support the health and wellness activities for all participants. Funds will also be utilized to provide technology training to paraprofessional staff members at each site to increase their knowledge of relevant technology applications and build capacity to integrate technology and STEM activities into the daily activities provided for students.
