## Speaking – Classroom Tableau (Grade K)

Score	Descriptors
2	Responses at the 2 level are typically characterized by: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The student uses appropriate vocabulary that is relevant to the stimulus and effectively uses grammar and structures. Though the response may contain a few errors in usage, the student's meaning is clear.</li><li>• The student successfully answers the prompt and the response is consistent with the stimulus.</li></ul>
