


How the Program Works

- Evaluations—Youth, Teacher, Site




Counties that participated in 2014-2015

Impact

- Reaching a new audience was one of our team's main goals. Over 4,900 youth from 45
 COUNTIES across the state participated in the program over the past three years.
- 62 libraries across the state of Nebraska
- 46% had never partnered with Nebraska Extension for youth development programming in the past and 100% of the sites plan on participating in future

Grade Level Customizable

Lesson Length 60 Minutes






