# Brief Overview of the CIGs



- **Purpose:** Improve the delivery of services to migratory children whose education is interrupted by improving inter/intrastate coordination of MEPs.
- State Education Agencies (SEAs) that participate in a CIG receive one incentive grant award per year regardless of the number of CIGs in which it participates.
- SEAs in CIGs must implement the activities described in the project applications as a condition of their receipt of funds.
- CIG awards are treated as additional funds available to the SEA under the MEP State formula grant program. Awarded funds may be used to implement the approved CIG activities or to carry out any other activities authorized under the MEP.

# Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program



The general purpose of the MEP is to ensure that migrant children and youth fully benefit from the same free public education provided to other children. To achieve this, the MEP supports educational programs for migrant children to help reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves.

# Title I, Part C Migrant Education Program



State Educational Agencies use MEP funds to provide the following types of educational services:

- **Instructional Services** (e.g., educational activities for preschool-age children and instruction in elementary and secondary schools, such as tutoring before and after school); and
- **Support Services** (e.g., educationally related activities, such as advocacy for migrant children, health, nutrition; and social services for migrant families, necessary educational supplies and transportation).

# Instructional Services



State Migrant Education Programs (MEPs) are required to:

- Ensure that the special educational needs of migrant children are identified and addressed;
- Provide migrant students with the opportunity to meet the same challenging state academic content standards that all children are expected to meet;
- Promote interstate and intrastate coordination of services for migrant children, including providing for educational continuity through the timely transfer of pertinent school records; and
- Encourage family literacy services for migrant students and their families.

# Measurable Program Outcomes



- MPO 1.1b During 2018-19, 75% of 3-5-year-old migrant children participating in MEP-sponsored preschool instruction, will score proficient or show a 5% increase on the Teaching Strategies GOLD or the Statewide MEP Preschool Assessment Tool.
- MPO 2.1a/3.1a During 2018-19, 60% of K-12 migrant students who receive MEP-sponsored supplemental instructional services aimed at increasing student achievement in reading/writing and/or mathematics, will score proficient or above, or show a 5% increase on pre/post district assessments.
- MPO 3.1a During 2018-19, 75% of OSY utilizing OSY lessons (e.g., GOSOSY, ESL, math, reading) will demonstrate an average gain of 5% on OSY assessments.

# Preschool Initiative

The goals of the Preschool Initiative are to:

- Expand the capacity of state and local MEPs to serve migrant PK children.
- Ensure that more services are provided to migrant 3-5 year-old children and that these children demonstrate substantial and measurable educational gains.
- Disseminate evidence-based practices to the national MEP community and other stakeholders.
