


- Waiver #1: Meal service time flexibility
 - Flexibility for time & duration of meal service
- SP 08-2020/SFSP 04-2020: Non-congregate feeding
 - Allows grab & go, delivery and drive-thru
- Meal distribution for more than one day at a time

Meal Pick-Up

- Waiver #5: Parent/guardian/adult pick-up without child present
 - Parents/guardians can take meals home to children
 - Steps to ensure meals are provided to adults of enrolled children
 - Require advance sign up to receive meals
 - Use a roster to mark names
 - Hang-tag for car

Meal Pattern Flexibilities

- Waiver #4 Flexibility to serve meals that do not meet meal pattern requirements when needed
 - Food chain interruptions
 - Spoilage
 - Whole grain rich (NSLP)
 - Vegetable sub-groups (NSLP)
- Effort should be made to provide substitute
 - Purchase locally
 - Reach out to other distributors
 - Buy bulk and repackage (produce)
 - Serve two of the same component (fruits or vegetables in SFSP)

Monitoring Flexibilities

- Waiver #10: waives some on-site monitoring for SFSP sites
 - Omits onsite portion of site visits; instead, complete desk review of records
 - May delay four week window for completing reviews
 - If not continuing SFSP, must complete site visit in first four weeks
 - If SFSP continues, site visit may be conducted May June
 - Access the site visit form here

Fresh Fruit Vegetable Program

- SP 12-2020 allows operational flexibilities, allows for service of FFVP
 - All current FFVP sites at times operators determine appropriate
 Open SFSP FFVP to all children
 - FFVP serving size must reflect what would typically be provided
 - Children must be present
 - FFVP funds can used through June 30, 2020 or by the expiration of Public Health Emergency, whichever is first

Area Eligibility Waiver

SFSP Background

- Open sites:
 - Eligibility requirements:
 - 50% students eligible for free/reduced meals
 - Census block area
 - Serve meals to all children 1-18 years of age
- SFSP Closed Enrolled Program
 - Eligibility requirements:
 - 50% of program participants eligible for free/reduced meals
 - Meals served to participants enrolled in their program

Area Eligibility Waiver

- Waiver available to School Food Authorities currently providing meals through:
 - National School Lunch Program
 - Summer Food Service Program (closed enrolled program)
- Application required
 - Complete <u>application survey</u>
 - Provide local information regarding economic impact
- Approval to operate as open site
 - April 1st through remainder of school year



Emergency Meals To You

- Eligibility:
 - Have at least 50% of enrollment eligible for free or reduced-priced meals,
 - Be closed for at least four weeks, and
 - Fall under the designation of rural
- Districts not "rural" can qualify if:
 - Transportation barriers
 - Contracting with a mass caterer is not viable
- Connect to vendors with capacity to purchase, package, and deliver a box of meals containing 10 or more meals
 - Frequently Asked Questions.

Emergency Meals to You

- Process
 - School Food Authority completes application on MTY website
 - Submits application to NDE
 - NDE approves application, submits to MTY
- Enrollment period
- Meal delivery to free & reduced students
