<u>Spring 2020 Nebraska Regional Programs Online Professional Development</u> Opportunities

Free online training for Para-educators. In response to district requests for online training for para educators during the coming weeks, our Tri State ASD Partners have put together 3 online training sessions. Each session covers best practice information on working with students with autism and related disabilities. A Certificate of Completion for CEU hours is available at the end of each session. The entire session must be completed to earn the certificate of attendance for CEUs.

Session 1 Includes Lessons On: What is ABA, Overview of Structured Teaching Components, Data Collection and Measurement, Introduction to Antecedent Based Intervention and Reinforcement (7 CEU hours)

Session 2 Includes Lessons On: Assessment/Observation, Skill Acquisition, and Teaching Procedures (7 CEU hours)

Session 3 Includes Lesson On: Challenging Behavior, and Behavior Reduction Strategies (7 CEU hours)

Achieve the Core

A <u>7-part mini-course</u> offers educators the opportunity to learn how phonological awareness and phonics connect to early reading. Topics include phonological and phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency and assessment.

Alabama Scottish Rite Foundation

<u>Three pre-recorded webinars</u> and a variety of live, interactive webinars (upon request) include information on dyslexia screening, dyslexia intervention, classroom accommodations and assistive technology, and best practices for Response to Intervention/Problem Solving Team processes.

Arkansas Educational Television Network

This <u>40-minute online video</u> provides an overview of the characteristics of dyslexia, how dyslexia fits into RTI and special education evaluation processes, and the importance of screening and early intervention.

Colorado Department of Education

The Colorado Department of Education currently offers open access to <u>video-based</u> <u>online course modules</u> covering noted researcher David Kilpatrick's Assessing, Preventing, and Overcoming Reading Difficulties.

Consortium on Reaching Excellence in Education (CORE)

CORE currently has a free <u>1-hour webinar</u> called *Understanding Dyslexia*: How to *Identify, Prevent and Remediate Word Level Reading Difficulties*. Participants will learn best practices for screening for, identifying and supporting students struggling with dyslexia.

Cox Campus – Atlanta Speech School

The Atlanta Speech School provides birth to elementary programs for children with speech, dyslexia and other language-based disorders. Its Cox Campus is an online portal that provides resources and <u>free video courses</u> on building children's language, reading and writing skills.

Dyslexia International

Dyslexia International provides a <u>free online training course</u> to help teachers identify dyslexia and learn about best practices for teaching literacy to children who struggle with reading and writing. The course is scientifically-based and offered in a Massively Open

Online Course (MOOC) format via the website Coursera. The initial version of the course was presented at the UNESCO-sponsored 2010 World Dyslexia Forum, and it has since been adapted into a teacher training program by the Belgian Ministry of Education.

Friday Institute for Educational Innovation

This <u>free online MOOC</u> is available twice per year. It covers foundational reading skills with the goal of preparing teachers to equip students in grades K–3 with the skills they need to become successful readers.

Microsoft, in partnership with Made By Dyslexia

In January 2019 Microsoft published <u>five dyslexia awareness video modules</u>. The modules seek to empower teachers and parents to understand and recognize dyslexia and work toward inclusive classrooms for students with dyslexia.

Reading Rockets

In collaboration with the Center for Effective Reading Instruction and the International Dyslexia Association, Reading Rockets offers <u>free online course modules</u> that present some of the core information teachers need to help young children learn to read and write well and to support children who struggle. The modules cover topics that include print awareness, phonological and phonemic awareness, fluency and spelling. Reading Rockets also has an <u>online teacher toolbox</u> with topical information and videos demonstrating effective instruction in areas of literacy.

South Carolina Department of Education

The South Carolina Department of Education produced three professional development modules intended for kindergarten through third grade teachers, interventionists and coaches. The modules are publicly available and cover what dyslexia is, how screenings can identify it, and evidence-based instruction for students with dyslexia.

Virginia Department of Education

The Virginia Department of Education created a publicly available <u>dyslexia</u> <u>awareness module</u> for all K-12 educators. The module covers characteristics of dyslexia, evidence-based interventions and accommodations for students with dyslexia, and screening for students with reading problems. <u>A transcript of the video module</u> is also available.
